Kia ora whānau,

As I write this I'm starting my 6th week at Glenorchy School! I've now had the chance, during this time, to teach in both the junior and senior class and feel I'm getting to know each of the students a little better every week.

Well done to Bella, Henry and Chace who represented the school at the Wakatipu Zone Swimming Sports last week and thanks to their parents who also supported them at this event.

I also attended my first Board of Trustees meeting last week and got the opportunity to work with this team. Below is a brief summary of the highlights from this meeting.

Board of Trustees Update.

The Board of Trustees meet twice a term and last Tuesday was our first meeting for term 3.

- Here's a few of the highlights from that meeting:
 - The BOT are currently working with the Playgroup, The Glenorchy Collective Trust and the Ministry of Education to agree on a lease arrangement for the area that currently houses the pool and playgroup buildings. This land is owned by the Ministry but is leased to allow it to be used by these groups. Because the Glenorchy Collective Trust have a plan to build a new Early Childhood facility in the future a new lease agreement needs to be negotiated.

• Each meeting the BOT is tasked with reviewing policies. This month we looked at the appointments policy which regulates how appointments are made and who will be involved.

• The BOT reviewed the budget against spending. We are 67% of the way through the financial year and most budget areas are on track for the year.

• Tracy reported to the BOT the outcomes from the parents recent feedback re Health programmes in the school. This work is still ongoing as the staff and I are now reviewing, and in some places rewriting, the curriculum delivery plan in light of parents feedback to ensure the areas for greatest focus are given priority. These areas in order of priority are:

- -Relationships
- -Responsible decision making
- -Physical safety
- -Physical activity
- -Self worth
- -Food and Nutrition

We are also reaching out to see if there are ways we can use the SWIS counselor, Vicky, to support teaching across classes around positive relationships, decision making and self worth. Thank you to everybody who took the time to complete the survey. Your feedback has been very useful. • The BOT are continuing to talk to the Glenorchy Community Association about the car parking and safety issues outside the school gate. This is a piece of ongoing work that the BOT continues to follow-up and represent the school communities desires in this area.

• The BOT, after much discussion about the gaps we have in expertise on the BOT, have decided to co-opt Andrew Green to the BOT to replace Alice Wilkins who recently resigned. Andrew brings a wealth of practical experience and will fill this position until the mid-term election in May 2025.

2025 Class Arrangement

At the beginning of the term at parent interviews some junior parents asked about the class arrangements for 2025, in particular where the current year 3's would be next year.

Tracy has spoken to the BOT and we thought it might be helpful for families to be made aware now of the schools intentions for 2025 class arrangements.

Next year, <u>the mostly likely arrangement</u>, given no dramatic changes in roll or staffing <u>levels</u>, is that the senior class will start 2025 as a year 4-8 class with approximately 16 pupils (ie. current year 3's will move through at the beginning of next year). The junior class will start the year with approximately 10 pupils with at least 6 new entrants expected during the year.

Attendance Matters

As many of you will have seen in the news this year, the government is concerned about attendance rates in New Zealand schools and has begun a weekly collection of attendance data from every school.

At last week's Board of Trustees meeting I reported on some of the attendance statistics for Glenorchy School. As a Principal and a BOT we want to achieve the very best learning and social outcomes for the students at this school. To do this children need to attend school regularly (by definition this is 90% or more of the time school is open).

What research shows us is children who are at school:

- *Have less learning gaps
- *Know what is happening
- *Often enjoy school more
- *Can achieve to their potential
- *Have increased self-esteem

*Establish good relationships with their peers and their teacher

It would be great to see each school pupil achieving a 90%+ attendance rate this term as this is where the government suggests all students should sit.


