Join us for a fun-filled holiday programme. Led by art teacher Michelle, our multidisciplinary arts programme is designed to spark creativity.

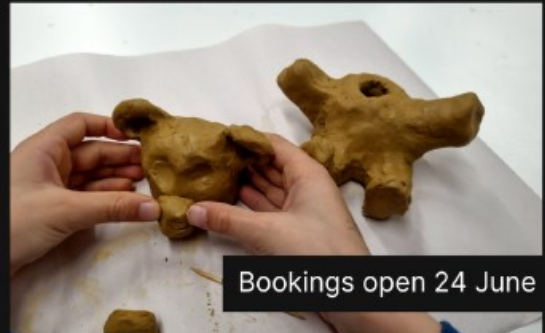


## Workshop for Rangatahi - Storywriting for the Screen
