We also got to learn about the significance of the koru shape in Maori art making clay necklaces, how to use rakau (wooden sticks) for hand eye coordination and performance and to make delicious fry bread.

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BOT meeting Summary

Last night the BOT met for their September meeting. Here are a few of the highlights from the meeting:

- The BOT welcomed Andrew Green to his first meeting.
- The BOT resigned the bus funding contract they have with the Ministry of Education to continue to provide bus services to the school through a contractor (Nomads).
- The BOT reviewed the Child Protection Policy.
- The BOT received the summarised data from the Student Wellbeing survey conducted with the senior class last month. This has provided some insight into areas the school can focus, supporting students. We are hopeful the the Support Worker In Schools Counsellor will have time available next term to support teachers with delivering some programmes around these key areas.
- The BOT is moving into a busy time of the year. Alongside Paula and Gorettie the BOT will be working over the next month to prepare the draft 2025 budget.
- The BOT has asked the staff to create a list of purchases they would like to see the school make. This will help the BOT prioritize the budget spending areas for next year.
- Ministry of Education has notified schools they have allocated 2 teacher only days in 2025 for staff to explore and become more familiar with the new Math Curriculum. The school are allowed to decide when these days will be so sometime next year Paula will let you know.
- The BOT set a date for the **Spring Working Bee.** This will be on **Sunday 3 November from 10-12pm** with a sausage sizzle to follow. We hope many families can come along to make light work of the jobs that need done.
- The BOT are keen to develop a garden plan moving forward that would map out the development or redevelopment of areas around the school so that moving forward there could be some budgeting for planting or redevelopment areas.
- Next term the school will be back into the Garden to Table gardening programme.
- We know there are some parents or friends of the school who might be interested in helping out with this alongside the students. If you are interested can you please <u>add your name to this document</u> and the school will be in touch next term.
